Names of the Recipients of University Gold-Centred Silver Medals Postgraduate

The candidates entitled to receive University Gold-Centred Silver Medals for standing FIRST in order of merit in different Postgraduate Examinations.

According to the decisions of the Court (items 1 & 3 of agenda of the meetings dated 21.1.94 and 31.1.94 respectively), the eligibility to receive a University medal for the First and Second rank holders will be determined by the following conditions (for both lab-based and non-lab-based subjects) ;

- (a) The candidate(s) must obtain at least 55% (fifty five percent) of the Total Marks in the subject based on the combined aggregate of Part-I and Part-II examinations both at the PG and the UG (Hons.) levels.
- (b) In the 'case of a tie' (either at the 1st or at the 2nd position) for non-lab-based subjects, the candidate securing higher/highest total marks in Theoretical Papers (on the basis of combined results of Part-I and Part-II examinations) will be given the higher rank. This will apply to both the PG and the UG (Hons.) levels.

- (c) Where after elimination of practical total marks the theoretical marks of the candidates in lab-based subjects will be the same, the examinee receiving higher marks in larger number of theoretical papers (including special papers) will get the higher rank.
- (d) If the tie cannot be broken even after that the matter will be referred to the Executive Council and the **decision** of the Executive Council in this respect will be final.
- (e) In the cases of non-lab-based subjects (both at the PG and the UG level) all the above criteria will be applicable.
- (f) For **Endowment Medals**, the criterion to obtain at least 55% (fifty five percent) of the total marks in the subject will be applicable only where there is a similar provision of the Deed of Agreement.

But in the case of a tie, the conditions as laid down above will apply for both PG and UG cases.

ENDOWMENT MEDALS AND PRIZES

1. Lakshmimoni Paul Memorial Medals/Prizes in History

Sri Provanshu Sekhar Paul of GC-183, Sector-III, Bidhannagar, (Salt Lake City) Calcutta - 91, donated to the University, a sum of Rs. 25,000-00 (Rupees twenty five thousand only) for creation of an endowment fund for the annual award of two medals / prizes in the memory of his mother the late Lakshmimoni Paul, to the candidates standing first and second in M.A. Examination in History.

The Executive Council accepted the donation with thanks on 16-06 93 and decided that the medals/prizes be awarded from the year 1993 out of the interest accrued from the amount.

2. Asutosh Paul Memorial Medals/Prizes in Political Science

Sri Provanshu Sekhar Paul further placed at the disposal of University a sum of Rs. 25,000-00 (Rupees twenty five thousand) only for creating an endowment fund for awarding two medals/prizes in the memory of his father the late Asutosh Paul to the candidates ranking first and second positions in M.A. Examination in Political Science.
