1. The M. Phil course structure in Economics designed on the basis of the University guidelines was approved as follows:

A. 1. M. Phil in Economics will be a Two-year course. In the first year there will be two Semesters of 400 Marks. In the second year there will be M. Phil Dissertation of 100 Marks. Each Semester will be of 4 courses (Papers) and each course will be of 50 marks. Minimum no. of classes per course will be 30. In each course of 50 marks, 40 marks will be on written test and 10 marks will be on Internal Assessment.
