- 1. Attempt any *one* of the following (within 300 words): 10 × 1
  - (a) Show how Achebe problematizes the issue of gender in *Things fall Apart*.
  - (b) Write a note on the use of symbols in *Things*Fall Apart.

- (c) Critically examine the interracial relationship between Mary Turner and Moses in Doris Lessing's *The Grass is Singing*.
- (d) Justify the appropriateness of the title of Doris Lessing's novel *The Grass is Singing*.
- 2. Attempt any one of the following (within 300 words):  $10 \times 1$ 
  - (a) In A Dance of the Forests, Soyinka aspires to act as "the conscience of his society rather than its hypocritical praise-singer". Discuss.
  - (b) How does Demoke's role in A Dance of the Forests embody Soyinka's idea of the significance of an artist?
  - (c) How does Soyinka describe the African ritual theatre in his essay *Drama and the African World-view* to distinguish it from the Western idea of theatre?
  - (d) Show how Soyinka establishes with reference to J.P. Clark's play, Song of a Goat that

inadequate knowledge of the African world view impedes proper appreciation of the play.

- 3. Attempt any *one* of the following (within 300 words):  $10 \times 1$ 
  - (a) Comment on the centrality of the metaphor of the 'house' in A House for Mr. Biswas.
  - (b) Discuss Naipaul's use of irony and humour in A House for Mr Biswas.
  - (c) Discuss how "A Far Cry from Africa" deals with the theme of split identity and the consequent anxiety.
  - (d) Comment on the epigraph to "Crusoe's Journal" and show how it relates to the poem.
- 4. Comment on any two of the following (each comment should be within 100 words):  $5 \times 2$ 
  - (a) The ending of Things Fall Apart.

- (b) The reference to Christopher Columbus in "Crusoe's Journal".
- (c) The Half-child in A Dance of the Forests.
- (d) The "chthonic presences" in the African worldview.
- (e) Mr. Biswas's ominous sixth finger in A House for Mr. Biswas.
- (f) The newspaper report of the murder of Mary Turner with which *The Grass is Singing* begins.

- 1. Answer any *one* of the following questions (with in 300 words):  $10 \times 1$ 
  - (a) Do you subscribe to the view that Bharati Mukherjee's Jasmine reinforces dominant negative stereotypes about India? Give reasons in support of your answer.

- (b) Discuss Jasmine as a modified version of the traditional literary picaro.
- (c) Examine the role of memory in *The Shadow Lines*.
- (d) Partition precipitates both geographical and psychological dislocation in *The Shadow Lines*. Discuss.
- 2. Answer any *one* of the following question (within 300 words):  $10 \times 1$ 
  - (a) Consider the diasporic features as delineated in *Midnight's Children*.
  - (b) Ice Candy Man records Lenny's journey from innocence to experience. Discuss.
  - (c) Buddha of Suburbia presents a generational clash within a diasporic community. Comment.
  - (d) 'A Temporary Matter' is a story about the temporary erasing of memory in order to escape its torture. Discuss.

- 3. Answer any *one* of the following question (within 300 words):  $10 \times 1$ 
  - (a) Critically examine Rushdie's observations, in *Imaginary Homelands*, on the purpose served by literature.
  - (b) Critically discuss the significance of the title of Rushdie's *Imaginary Homelands*.
  - (c) Consider Stuart Hall's use of the notions of 'being' and 'becoming' in the formation of cultural identities.
  - (d) Explain Why Stuart Hall employs the notion of Derridean 'difference' in situating black diaspora in the Caribbean islands.
- 4. Comment on any *two* of the following (each comment should be within 100 words):  $5 \times 2$ 
  - (i) Jasmine's encounter with Half-Face.
  - (ii) The Child's confusion over Mr. Pirzada's identity in 'when Mr. Pirzada Came to Dine'.

- (iii) Tridib's death in The Shadow Lines.
- (iv) Use of the term "Chutnification" in Midnight's Children.
- (v) The role of Armet Francis in the unification of the black diaspora.
- (vi) Rushdie's description of Bombay in Imaginary Homelands.
