- Bring out, after Walter Benjamin, the significance of the work of art losing its 'aura' in an eye of mechanical reproduction. Discuss with reference to his observations on photography.
- 3. Critically comment on Freud's analysis of the causes of the West's discontent in its own civilisation.
- 4. Write a short essay on Saussure's idea of 'linguistic value' as expressed in his essay.

#### Unit-II

- 5. Discuss Foucault's idea of 'author-function' in his essay "What Is an Author?"
- Discuss any two of the principal proposition of Barthes relations to his discourse on Text in "From Work to Text".
- 7. Explain with illustrations how Lacan frames the relationship between the subject and the signifier in his "Seminar on "the Purloined Letter"."
- 8. Examine the 'Afterword' to Said's Orientalism as a rejection of both "insouciant nativism and militant militarism of the nationalist consensus."

#### Unit-III

- Discuss after Deleuze and Guattari the three characteristics of 'minor literature' with suitable illustrations.
- 10. What according to Baudrillard, are the three orders of simulacra? How does he distinguish between simulation and science fiction? Answer with reference to his essay.
- 11. How does Frederic Jameson link Marxist critical thought with cultural analysis in order to counter the tenets of western structuralism. Answer with reference to the work of Jameson that you have read.
- 12. Examine Lyotard's essay "An Answer to the Question: What is the Postmodern?" as a rejoinder to Habermas's "Modernity: An Unfinished Project".
