





GENERAL INFORMATION

The University was established on 29 September 1981, by an act called the **VIDYASAGAR UNIVERSITY** Act, 1981 (West Bengal Act XVIII of 1981) after the name of Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, the great educationist and social worker of Bengal. The University Grants Commission accorded recognition to the University under 12 B on March 01,1990.

Mission : The University is established with a mission to meet the divergent needs of the region – ethnic, socio-cultural and geographical along with providing the mainstream education. The University logo with the motto "EDUCATION, KNOWLEDGE, PROGRESS" embodies the mission as stated.

Jurisdiction : The University has its well-marked jurisdiction which shall not be extended beyond the limit of Midnapore district (after division now Paschim Medinipur and Purba Medinipur districts) or any district which may be created in future out of any part thereof. Thirty Colleges under Calcutta University within the district of the then undivided Midnapore district were deemed to have been affiliated to Vidyasagar University.

Area : The total area of the University campuses (semi rural location) is 138.78 acres. **Main Campus :** 103.74 acres, Residential Campus – 35.04 acres.

It would be noteworthy to mention here that two Memorandums of Understanding have been signed between Vidyasagar University and Yunnan Minzu University, Kunming, China.

Besides, the Academic departments are regularly publishing the Departmental Journals of Research.

8. Convocation:

The seventeenth Convocation of the University was held on 8th January 2015 at the newly built University Auditorium "Vivekananda Sabhagriha". This is first time in the history of the University that its convocation is held in its own Auditorium.

The convocation ceremony was presided over by His Excellency Mr. Keshari Nath Tripathy, Hon'ble Chancellor of Vidyasagar University and Governor of West Bengal. It's also a great pleasure to note that Dr. Partha Chatterjee, Hon'ble Minister –in-charge, Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal was kind enough to grace the occasion as Guest-of-Honour.

Professor K. N. Ganesh, Director, IISER Pune was the Chief Guest. He delivered the Convocation Address. He pointed out the needs of the day for development of Science education in India for which he suggested some measures:

- a) <u>Symbiosis of undergraduate teaching and research</u>: He stated in most of the colleges where UG teaching is done, unfortunately there is no research culture even among the best of them. As a result during the important period of students life of UG education they do not get to experience the excitement and challenge of research; this is leading to considerable decline of interest in science among young students, with imminent lower priority for pursuing higher education in science and research careers.
- b) **Postdoctoral Research Programmes:** It is recognized all over the world that Postdoctoral Fellows are the main backbone of research system abroad, taking up challenging problems because of their already acquired research skills. But this culture is completely absent in India.

He also mentioned the problems of Research Funding in India and stressed on proper coordination between Industry and Academia.

Prof. K. N. Ganesh also made aware that World is moving so fast that even to be stationary we need to keep running; no one has patience, interest or time to listen to reasons for our failure. Each one of us in the academic arena has to selflessly contribute in appropriate and substantial measure to raise the quality and outcome of our education.

The recipients of the Honorary Degrees were three eminent personalities- Professor (Dr.) Sabyasachi Bhattacharya, Shri Sirshendu Mukhopadhyay and Professor Vibhav Bhusan Upadhyay.

Professor Sabyasachi Bhattacharya (D.Litt.) is a Tagore National Fellow, Govt. of India. He was earlier the Vice-Chancellor of Visva- Bharati and chairman on ICHR.

Shri Sirshendu Mukhopadhyay (D.Litt.) is a very eminent Writer and a Novelist par excellence. He has received many awards for his works like Sahitya Academy Award, Ananda Puraskar etc.

Professor Vibhav Bhusan Upadhyay is former Advocate General of Uttar Pradesh and former Vice-Chancellor of Prayag Mahila Vidyapith, Uttar Pradesh.

NAAC Re-Accreditation (3rd Cycle): The NAAC Peer Team visited the University from 11 to 14 November 2014. They visited all the Academic and Administrative Departments and facilities interacted with all kinds of stakeholders. After assessment by the team the Vidyasagar University has been awarded 'B' Grade and 2.86 in a 4-Point CGPA scale in this 3rd Cycle of Re-Accreditation.

Vidyasagar University started its academic activities during the 7th plan period(1985) from the session 1985-86 following an Act of the State Assembly to cater to the needs of higher education with special emphasis on all round development of the rural areas of the agro-based district of Midnapore (undivided). CENTRAL LIBRARY

1. Year of establishment : 1986

2. **About the Central Library :** The Central Library of Vidyasagar University is a central facility, which provides information support for teaching and research activities of the university with a rich collection of text books, serials, reference documents, theses and back-volume periodicals. The Library was established in the year 1986 and since then it has been growing in size and content and finally in the year 1996 it was housed in its present four-storey building with about 23 thousand Sq. ft. covered area in the midst of the academic complex of the University. A book elevator is used for shifting books and other reading materials in different floors.

It is a completely automated library and the books, journals, theses, etc. acquired by the library can be searched online using OPAC terminals installed near the entrance gate. The Circulation counter and the library office remains open from 10-00 AM to 5-30 PM on all weekdays (excluding university holidays) whereas the general Reading Room, Reference unit and the Periodicals Section remains open from 10-00 AM to 7.30 PM from Monday to Friday and from 10-00 AM to 5-30 PM on Saturdays and Sundays.

A Centre for Digital Resource Services is running successfully at first floor with 24 computers for the library users to access the available online resources and internet surfing. Besides the main reading hall, a Career Information Library and a Ph.D cell are located in the ground floor to serve the users as per their requirements.

The construction work of the extension part of the library building is going on in full swing and expected to be completed within a couple of months.

Library Collection : At present the university central library has a total collection of 1,10,618 purchased books, 439 e-books in various disciplines, 1633 CD-ROMs, 555 Ph.D theses awarded from this university and more than 5300 books as gift from various sources and had subscribed to 112 Indian journals on different disciplines. The library has also subscribed 09 national newspapers and 18 general magazines during the period under review. A good no. of text books for reference, conventional reference books as well as more than 1000 books on competitive examinations are available for consultation. Apart from these, the library has a good collection of reports like 'Census Reports', 'Development Reports', 'Education Reports', etc.

Library Membership : Total no. of bona fide library users is 3653 amongst which 3176 are PG students, 48 are full time (stipendiary) Research scholars, 09 are non-stipendiary Research scholars, 216 are Faculties and Administrative Officers and 126 are the no. of non-teaching staff. Besides these, 78 are registered as Ex-members of this institute and 12 no. of colleges are registered as Institutional members.

Besides these, the visiting faculty members from other institutions and visiting research fellows can also avail the library facilities as per library rules.

- (b) **Reprographic Service :** A private Xerox Centre has been operating at the university Central Library for providing photocopying services to all the library users at nominal charges.
- (c) OPAC Service : The Library Catalogue can be accessed online. The entire collection of University Library can be searched through OPAC of VU Central Library or through web-OPAC from any corner of the university campus as well as from outside the campus.. Library Catalogue is available from the <u>Central Library</u> link or from the <u>OPAC</u> link of the VU website at www.vidyasagar.ac.in.
- (d) **Resource Sharing & Institutional Membership :** As a member of INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad, the Vidyasagar University Central Library is engaged in resource sharing with the other participating university libraries through Document Delivery Services. The university library is the institutional member of two renowned libraries, namely IIT, Kharagpur and British Council Library, Kolkata since more than one decade from where our users can avail their required documents. On the other hand Vidyasagar university library also provides the library facilities to its own registered institutional members against a nominal membership fee.

3. Automation, Networking and Wi-Fi Services : The automation programme at the central library was started in the year 2001. Since then it had started automation of all its house-keeping activities using SOUL software package developed by INFLIBNET centre, Ahmedabad. At present our university library is fully computerized having thousands of databases of books, theses, current journals and library memberships, which are available on-line from any terminals within the library or within the campus through LAN and also from outside the campus through website. As a member of UGC-Infonet E-journal consortium, more than 7 thousand full text peer reviewed journals can be accessed within and outside the library. All bona fide members can avail internet and e-mail facilities from the central library only for their academic purposes.

Networking : The library network backbone is of 10 Gbps. The storage servers are connected to the backbone using multiple 1 Gbps paths.

Wi-Fi: The entire library along with its adjacent areas are completely Wi-Fi enabled. Bona fide users can avail this facility free of cost using their own gadgets like Laptop, Smartphone, etc.

4. **ICT Infrastructure :** The Library has developed its own ICT infrastructure to manage all the inhouse operations as well as providing specialized information services to its bona fide members. The following Servers are in operation in the Central Library.

Infrastructure Servers, Storage Servers [with a total 6 TB usable storage capacity]; Physical Servers, like Application Server [for the Thin Client machines], SOUL Server, CD/DVD Mirror Server, Management server [for VMWARE Host]; Virtual Servers like IIS WEB Server, Database Server, DNS Server, LDAP Server, Windows Software updates Server, Primary Windows Active Directory Server, EMC Secure Remote Support Server, VPN Server (For remote connectivity), Office Scan Antivirus Server, FTP server and IP Surveillance Management Server.

Computers and other accessories : In addition to the above infrastructure, library has more than 30 Desktop PCs, 36 Thin Client PCs, one Network Printer (for printing document through LAN), one High End Scanner and handheld Barcode Scanners.

5. ICT Services :

(i) **Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) :** The OPAC is one of the most heavily used databases of the library and is accessible 24x7 via library web page. Besides listing all the documents available in the library, OPAC is searchable by author, title, accession number, subject and many other fields. 12 PCs are provided at the entrance lobby for OPAC searching.

(ii) **E-Journals and Online Database Service :** The Central Library provides web-based access to over 7,000 full text journals and 12 databases (available from INFLIBNET Centre) 24 x 7 on institute-wide network.

(iii) **D-space Repository & E-Books :** Central Library has set up an archive of publications brought out by the institute. The archive is being updated regularly to cover more publications which are permissible within the copyright regulations. The archive is expected to evolve into a database of all publications produced by the Vidyasagar University community and is accessible on the Internet through the library homepage. Presently hundreds of electronics references like, CD-ROM databases, Administrative Documents (annual reports, meeting resolutions, etc.), Old question papers (P.G, M.Phil, etc), University journals, etc. are archived in the D-space repository.

(iv) Web Based Faculty Information & e-Circular System (with SMS and email alert) : Library has recently hosted one web based faculty information system in which all the faculty member can upload their Bio-data, communicate with their student, generate departmental notice etc. Moreover we have also hosted another information dissemination system in which all the registered users can upload notification, reports etc in the public domain and also send alert (SMS and email) to the specified group of people.

(v) **SMS Alert Service :** The central library has recently introduced sms alert service to all its registered users in which any service oriented information is sent to the users through their registered mobile number.

(v) WEB Based Email Service : This service enables you to access your mailbox from anywhere (inside or outside university campus) through internet. The current service is given through Google apps with some local modifications. The email address of the user is <user name>@mail.vidyasagar.ac.in. Library is also maintaining lists server to send emails to a group of users.

(vii) **CD/DVD** Access Service : The Library has installed CD/DVD mirror server (lots of CDs have already been archived) to store the contents of CDs and DVDs and provide accessibility of digital data archive throughout the campus through local area network

(viii) **Print Service :** Library is equipped with a modern network printer associated with the CDRS lab with automatic print quota management software. This is mainly used by the registered library members to print their documents against a nominal payment.

(ix) **Consultancy Service :** For the colleges affiliated to this university and having the institutional membership to this university consultancy services has been introduced to solve the automation related problems of their libraries. Registered members can also get remote support (through telephonic conversation) in case of failure of any service. This is a paid service offered to the registered members only.

(x) **Remote Access Service :** The Central Library has recently started to provide Remote access facilities to the registered Faculties, Research Scholars and the registered bona fide staff of this university in which all the resources available in the university library will be available from anywhere outside the campus.

The Computer Centre of Vidyasagar University, established in 1998, plays a pioneer role in distributing the knowledge in computer and its application among students, staff of educational institute and the peoples of different communities in and around the rural areas of west Bengal where the university is situated. It has crossed a number of milestones and continues to increase the activities in new areas of application. It provides full computational facilities to the faculty members, research scholar, and students of the University. It also offers opportunities to learn computer and its application to faculty members, research scholars, students, staff of the University and College by opening a number of regular courses, training program, organizing seminar, workshops for them. To provide industry and research oriented learning and education to the students it also has some collaborative approach with the IT companies and research Lab and Institute.

Maintaining existing ICT Services and new initiatives.

(a) Up gradation of State of the Art campus LAN, switch Infrastructure (Wired and WI-FI LAN) under NME-ICT:

The most awaited campus wide LAN infrastructures (Switching Devices) have been commissioned with high speed state of the art switching devices CISCO to improve the availability, stability, speed and overall performance of the LAN and internet facilities. Presently, all the services are being provided with the new upgraded setup. All the departmental users have been given direct connectivity for high speed. The whole setup is kept on 24 hours including holidays. The total cost approx. 45 lacks taken from XII plan grant.

The University has a one GBPS internet connectivity terminated at computer centre under **NME-ICT & NKN project**. For security and safety of the campus wide LAN setup the gateway lab is equipped with high end Router (MX80-Juniper), fortigate firewall, etc. The **Fortigate 200B** has been installed at the Centre. The Fortinet 300D will be installed at Computer Centre very soon.

To protect the campus from external threat, viruses, spam Trend Micro Office Scan (antivirus) has been introduced in server based system and to control the client computer throughout the campus in centralized control system.

(b) Wi-Fi Connectivity:

To provide wireless internet connection, new Wi-Fi LAN has been installed in the Administrative Building and Rangamati Guest House.

(c) Monitoring bandwidth utilization & maintenance of 1 GBPS link under NME-ICT/NKN project:

The prestigious 1 GBPS link had been installed in 2010 with low b/w utilization. However some direct connectivity and increase of users and new services has increased the bandwidth utilization even upto 250 MBPS and sometimes 300 MBPS. This has been monitored 24 hours using the firewall system.

(d) Virtual A/V Centre

A-Virtual Audio Visual Centre is being established in the Computer Centre to conduct virtual classes, transmit live lectures and Multimedia materials and generate e-content thereby. The A-V centre may also be used as various eminent lectures, recording etc. This facility will be offered to all faculty members of the various departments, all the PG students and other communities of the university so that they can use the various NME-ICT services in their research and course curricula.

(e) CCTV

CCTV cameras surveillance systems have been installed in the campus through Computer Centre.

(f) Internet and Other LAN Services

The Computer centre is also looking after the total internet services provided to each and every dept. through the new program under this project NME-ICT launched in the XI plan by MHRD & State Government.

The new 1 GBPS (1000 MBPS) Leased Line has already been commissioned from November, 2010.

The University has also obtained a 2 MBPS backup Internet Connectivity (Broadband) from BSNL during 2006-2007 to enhance the Quality of Service throughout the Campus even during peak working hours.

The total number of computer having Internet and LAN connectivity has been increased to about 1000 including WI-FI at present.

All these Internet users are able to access all the subscribed e-Journals (full text) under e-Journal Consortia of Inflibnet.

REGULAR ACTIVITY:

Central Stock:

Records each and every technical detail information of all Computers, Printers, UPS, Software & Other accessories / peripherals in the Campus. Central ID allocation after physical inspection for each machine is also controlled through it. At present the total no. of desktop computers *is966approximately, total no. of Laptop is 113.*

Maintenance of IT accessories:

Maintenance of Computers, Printers, Ups and other peripherals are done through Central Maintenance system. The centralized maintenance is done by an external vendor under this department whose performance is thoroughly evaluated periodically on feedback basis from different department, based on which payment is made and further contract is made or renewed.

Department also supervise the Annual Maintenance work (AMC) of the external agencies regarding these machines. At present 660 desktop computers &90 Laptops are under AMC service.

Administrative Automation:

A customized Management Information System for the Administrative Departments regarding receive and dispatch has been developed in collaboration with Information Scientist and now it is under test phase. It is a web based application and this can be accessed within the campus network by the user authentication.

Finance Section:

A customized software for the department of finance has been developed by external agency under the supervision of the department of Programmer for processing the following dayto-day financial transactions-Payroll, PF, ITAX, Bank Reconciliation, GI, Salary Register, Form16, Form24 preparation, Budget etc. supervision, monitoring, up gradation, consultancy, guidance & direct involvement in day-to-day computerized financial work.

Also provides guidance as an**Technical Expert in the purchase committee** for purchase of computers and other computer related peripherals.

Controllers' Section:

Softwares (Examiner / Paper setter, Result & Postgraduate Mark sheet preparation Review etc.) supervision, monitoring, up gradation and guidance to day-to-day computerized works.

A web basedprogramme is going to be developed for PG mark sheet preparation under the supervision of the Programmer in consultation with the Information Scientist.

Engineers' Section:

Software for Electric bill generation, supervision, monitoring, up gradation and guidance to day-to-day computerized works.

Registrars' Section:

Software (Registration) supervision, monitoring, up gradation and guidance to day-to-day computerized works.

Internet & e-mail:

Regular monitoring of University's Internet account, e-mail account. Also keep monitoring and assistance to Computer Centre and Central Library for network and others as and when required.

DSW Section:

Preparation of Self Learning Materials (SLM's)




AV Materials :-

(Percentage of attendance of students in PCP during the period April, 2014 to March, 2015)







Registrar, Vidyasagar University was the Chief-Guest. He spoke on the importance of organizing such literacy camp from University. The Inaugural speech delivered by Prof. Bidhan Chandra Patra, Dean of Science faculty, Vidyasagar University. Rai Chattopadhyay Lower Division District & Session Judge, Paschim Medinipur and the chairman, District Legal Service Authority Paschim Medinipur was the Guest- of-Honour. Smt. Sutanuka Nag, Additional District & Session Judge, 2nd Court Paschim Medinipur, Special Judge under POCSO Act, Sri. Sujit Kr. - 2. He delivered his speech regarding nutritional value of a present women and their daily calorie consumption ratio etc. Fifty one women from the area participated in this Awareness Training Programme.

3. Women's Studies Centre, Vidyasagar University Midnapore organized a lecture programme on **"Successful Aging Perspectives from South Asia, Europe and USA with special Reference to Women and Gender" on 18th February 2015 at Radhakrishnan Hall, Vidyasagar University. Welcome address was delivered by Dr. Sujata Maiti (Choudhury), Director, Women's Studies Centre. Dr. Jayanta Kishore Nandi, Actg. Registrar was the Guest-of-Honour and he spoke on the value of organizing this kind of women aging related programme. Prof. Trithankar Das Purkayastha Dean of Arts and Commerce, Vidyasagar University was the Guest-of-Honour and chairperson. In this lecture programme Sarah Lamb Professor of Anthropology, Brandeis University, USA was the resource person. She presented her different studies regarding this topic and gave a thought provoking lecture. At the end of the session vote of thanks was given by Dr. Asmita Bhattacharyya,**

Dept. of Sociology, Vidyasagar University. Ninety five students and four faculty members participated in the lecture programme.

4. Prof. Trithankar Das Purkayastha Dean of Arts and Commerce, Vidyasagar University was the inaugurator. Dr. Jayanta Kishore Nandi, Actg. Registrar, Vidyasagar University was the Chief Guest of this seminar. Prof. Bidhan Chandra Patra, Dean of Science, Vidyasagar University was Chairperson of this seminar. In the 1st technical session Prof. Prakash Chandra Dhara, Vidyasagar University, Midnapore chair the session. In this session, Associate Professor, Biological Anthropology Unit, Indian Statistical Institute, Kolkata, Dr. Susmita Mukhopadhyay shared her view and presentation her observation on this topic. The 2nd Speaker Dr. Chandan K. Pradhan Scientist E. (Dy. Director), Regional Occupational Health Centre (E), Indian Council of Medical Research, Kolkata shared his valuable Experience regarding health of working women in our country.

In the 2nd technical session of this seminar Ms. Shamita Sarkar, Vidyasagar University, Midnapore, chaired this session. Ms. Sarbani Goswami, Senior Research Officer, School of Women Studies, Jadavpur University, Kolkata was the speaker of this seminar. At the end of the technical session Part-II vote of thanks was given by Dr. Sovanjan Sarkar, Vidyasagar University, Midnapore. Total One twenty persons including students, faculties and staffs participated in this seminar.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance cell (IQAC) of Vidyasagar University has made an active effort to comply the national action plan of the NAAC and UGC for performance evaluation and quality up-gradation of the university. Sincere efforts have been made to enhance the academic excellence of the university. It also helped to disseminate information on the various quality parameters of higher education among the members of the university community.

The followings are the activities of IQAC in last year:

- 1. **Preparation for 3rd cycle of Accreditation by the NAAC**: IQAC took various initiatives for NAAC accreditation. The Self Study Report (SSR) was prepared and sent to NAAC. It extended help and support to the academic departments for preparing departmental profile and power point presentation for NAAC visit. It always kept contact with Engineering and other administrative departments for the infrastructural improvements of the university in relation to NAAC visit.
- 2. **Support for NAAC peer team visit to the University**: IQAC took an active role during the NAAC peer team visit. It kept contact with the NAAC office at Bangalore for the finalizing the date for visit. It also kept regular contacts with peer team members for their travel plan. IQAC, along with the members of different subcommittees, arranged everything for the hospitality of the peer team members. IQAC made the visit schedule of the NAAC Peer team in consultation with Chairman of the peer team and NAAC office. The IQAC extended all possible supports to the university authority for successful completion of NAAC peer tem visit.

The 3^{rd} cycle of the NAAC accreditation has been completed and obtained the Grade, which showed improvement in CGPA score in comparison to 2^{nd} cycle.

- 3. **Support for the process of CAS of the University teachers:** The IQAC participated in the process of career advancement scheme (CAS) for the university teachers. It computed the API scores for a number of cases for the promotion of teachers. The API scores of 25 teachers of the university have been completed. Beside this, API scores of the applicants for direct recruitment (open post) were computed. For this purpose it kept a regular contact with the registrar office and concerned teachers for verifying the related documents.
- 4. **Introduction of SAR for the teachers:** The IQAC suggested the university authority to introduce the Self Assessment Report (SAR) of the teachers, as par GO of the Govt. of West Bengal. The SAR has been introduced by the University.
- 5. **Record keeping:** The IQAC has taken the initiative for keeping the records of all SARs of the teachers in a systematic manner.
- 6. **AQAR:** The IQAC has prepared the annual report (AQAR) for the last academic year in the prescribed format of the NAAC by collecting information from the academic departments and administrative sections and it was sent to the NAAC.

Future Plan

- To enhance the collaborative research among the departments and to take initiative for interinstitutional collaboration
- To enhance the number of smart class room in the academic departments
- To enhance outreach programmes for the members of the backward community
- To introduce fully e-based system for different administrative processes like, admission, result publication etc
- To form departmental unit of IQAC. Each academic department may constitute an IQAC unit by incorporating two or three members.
- To improve student feedback system by preparing a analytical report of the same
- To build a central Animal House in the university

OFFICE OF THE MEDICAL OFFICER

1. The Medical Unit started at Vidyasagar University in 1998.From the period up to Sept, 2012 only One Medical officer was there in the Unit. No other Technical staff was present. From Oct, 2012 two technical staffs (as Medical Assistants) were recruited on contractual basis.

At present the Medical Unit is running with One Part-time basis Medical officer (Former Medical officer at study leave), Two Technical Assistants (Medical) and one Non-Technical Female Staff.

- 2. Medicines for the common ailments are being provided to the students and other university communities.
- 3. FirstAid facilities are being provided for the patients having injury or trauma.
- 4. In emergency cases E.C.G facilities and blood sugar measuring facility are also available in this unit.
- 5. If situation demands oxygen is given to the patients. Sometimes Pulso-Oxymeter machine is also used to check the Oxygen saturation in blood of the patient.
- 6. Ultrasonography test will be starting soon. (This is also waiting for proper space).
- 7. An Eye check up clinic will also be starting soon. Many modern equipments have been bought for this purpose. (This is also waiting for proper space)
- 8. In case of serious emergency patients are being referred to the Midnapore Medical College & Hospital by our Own Ambulance.
- 9. Annual Sports, Convocation and other important events which take place at the university campus or anywhere, the medical unit extends its service and co-operation during the period of these events.
- 10. Per month on an average about 220-250 numbers of patients visit the Medical Unit.

Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar (1820 - 1891)

Iswar Chandra Bandopadhyay was born on September 26, 1820 at Birsingha village in the undivided Midnapore district of West Bengal. His father was Thakurdas Bandopadhyay and mother Bhagawati Devi. He received his education in the Sanskrit Collegiate School and Sanskrit College, Calcutta. In recognition of his extraordinary performance in studies, the title "Vidyasagar" (Ocean of Learning) was conferred on him. Since then he became famous all over the country as Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar. In addition to this erudition he was also famous as "Dayar Sagar" (Ocean of Kindness) as recognition of his exemplary kindheartedness. He passed away on July 29, 1891 at the age of seventy.

Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar was a Bengalee Polymath and a pillar of the Bengal Renaissance. He was a philosopher, academic, educator, writer, translator, printer, publisher, entrepreneur, reformer and philanthropist - all rolled into one. He was one of the first person in India to realize that modern science was the key to India's future. He sought to inculcate a spirit of scientific inquiry among young Bengalees by emphasizing the importance of studying European Empiricist Philosophy of Francis Bacon and Inductive logic of John Stuart Mill. He was also great champion of the uplift of the status of women in India, particularly in Bengal. Unlike Some other reformers, who sought to set up alternative societies or systems, he endeavored to transform orthodox Hindu Society from within. In the face of opposition from the orthodox Hindu establishment, he vigorously promoted the idea of widow re-marriage. It was through his pioneering efforts that the Widow Re-marriage Act XV of 1856 was passed. As a first rate linguist, he re-constructed the Bengali alphabet and reformed Bengali typography into an alphabet of twelve vowels and forty consonants. His contribution to both Bengali and Sanskrit literature is immeasurable. Rectitude and Courage were the hallmark of Vidyasagar's character and he was decidedly much ahead of his time. Shortly after Vidyasagar's death, Rabindranath Tagore reverently wrote about him: "One wonders how God, in the process of producing forty million Bengalees, produced a man!"
