Part A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

The overall plan for enhancement of the quality during 2006-2007 are mentioned below :

- 3. To modernize library facilities and to spend more money for purchase of new books and journals.
- 4. To enhance students amenities and facilities and to encourage students to involve in NSS and other social activities.
- 5. To upgrade technology and computerization of different section.

- To introduce MBA (regular), PG Diploma in Mass Communication & Videography, PG Diploma in Library Automation.
- 7. To extend affiliation to UG Colleges for starting PG Courses.
- 8. Construction of new buildings.

<u> Part – B</u>

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution.

The University was established with the objectives to meet the divergent needs of the region – ethnic, socio cultural and geographical along with providing the mainstream education.

With the objective of providing the mainstream education the University is opening new departments to provide education in the modern and inter disciplinary subjects like – Biochemistry, Biotechnology, MBA etc.

In order to maintain the quality and standard of the system, examination reforms have been initiated by introducing semester system, internal assessment and continuous evaluation.

Regarding research and development activities the University and its depts. have developed MOUs with a number of research laboratories and outside organizations like NISTADS, MSV laboratories etc.

The university is situated in a backward tribal belt of the state. Our academic depts. are working on the diverse problems of the tribal people and trying to find out the probable solutions. These are rightly reflected in the research papers published by the depts. of Anthropology, Economics, Sociology etc.

The NSS wing is carrying on the programs like AIDS awareness, health awareness, immunization campaign in order to make people aware of real life problems.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG & PG)

Several new programmes have been initiated as mentioned below:

i) M.B.A. in regular mode.

- M.Sc. in Biotechnology started as affiliated course at Vidyasagar Institute of Health and Oriental Institute of Science and Technology.
- iii) M.Sc. in Biochemistry started as affiliated course at Vidyasagar Institute of Health and Oriental Institute of Science and Technology.
- iv) M.Sc. in Nutrition and dietetics at VIH.
- v) PG course in Mass Communication and Videography.
- vi) A number of new courses have been initiated by the University under VU-CMC collaborative programmes. These new courses are (a) PG Diploma in Applied Computer Science (b) Diploma in Advance Hardware and Networking Administration and (c) Certificate course in Basic and Advance Java.
- vii) PG programmes in UG colleges.

 i) Semester system of examination along with internal assessment has been introduced in the Departments of Microbiology, Physics and Technophysics, Computer Science, Economics, Aquaculture Management and Technology and Bio-Medical Laboratory Science and Management.

The Medical Unit of the University arranged a health check-up programme amongst the first year students. The Dept. of physiology and Dept. of Bio-Medical Laboratory Science & Management helps in this health check-up programme. In collaboration with NSS unit the Medical Unit organized health awareness and sanitation programmes.

33. Performance in sports activities:

The University organized Inter-College Football, Volleyball and Kho-kho tournaments in the newly developed Sports-Ground of the University. Our football team participated in the East Zone Inter- Varsity Football Tournament and qualified for the All India Tournament. Inter- College and PG Athletic Meet was held during February this year.

Cultural Team of the university succeeded in five cultural events in East Zone Inter-Varsity youth festival held at BIT, Ranchi and qualified in the Group Song event for participation in the National Youth Festival, Madras 2007 and secured the 3rd position.

35. Student Achievements and Awards:

A research scholar of physiology Department has got a scholarship for 3 years in MD Anderson Cancer Research Institute, Texas University, USA. Another scholar of Microbiology Dept. has received First prize for paper presentation at the Annual conference of the Association of Microbiologists in India held in Bhopal. A research scholar of the department of Physiology has won the best paper Award from the poster session of Indian Science Congress 2007.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling cell

There is no such Cell but the Dean of Student Welfare constantly inspires and guides the students.

37. Placement services provided to the students:

In order to assist the students in choosing their career opportunities, a Placement Cell with the Dean of Students Welfare as its convener has been functioning. The Placement Cell organized campus interviews for students. This year the students of MCA, Computer Science and Electronics departments appeared at the campus interview of IBM and US Technology companies and quite a good number of students have been absorbed by them. This year five more companies have expressed desire to organize campus interviews in our University.
