 - (a) How does Lamb blend humour and pathos in his essay The Superannuated Man'?
 - (b) Bring out the significance of the title of Nicolson's essay The Art of Living.
 - (c) Comment on Bose's opinion of Gandhi as revealed in "Bose-Rolland Interview".
 - (d) Comment on Nehru's view on the nation in *The Discovery of India*.

- (a) How does James Joyce convey the idea of 'waiting' in 'Araby'?
 - (b) Justify the significance of the title of O'Henry's "The Last Leaf".
- (c) Comment on the portrayal of the character of the Boss by Mansfield in her, short story 'The Fly'.
