 - (a) How does Macbeth become a tragic hero in spite of the fact that he is a villain?

Or

Write a note on the atmosphere of evil in *Macbeth*.

(b) Consider Twelfth Night as a Romantic comedy.

Or

Discuss the role of Feste as a representative Shakespearean Fool in Twelfth Night.

(c) Is the change in Lady Isabella's character convincing towards the end of Edward II? Discuss.

Or

Discuss Edward II as a play based on history.

- 3. Answer any one of the following questions: 10×1
 - (a) Is the Porter Scene in *Macbeth* in harmony with the horrors that surround it? Justify your answer.
 - (b) Bring out the dramatic significance of the Abdication scene in *Edward* II.
 - (c) Discuss the importance of songs in Twelfth Night.
- 4. Answer any one of the following questions: 5×1
 - (a) 'Give me excess of it, that, surfeiting,
 The appetite may sicken, and so die'.What does the speaker seek here? Bring out
 the analogy implicit here.
 - (b) What are the three apparitions the witches present before Macbeth?

(c) What letter of dubious sense does Young Mortimer send to bring about the death of Edward II?

- 5. Answer any one of the following questions: 15×1
 - (a) Sidney's "Loving in Truth" is less a poem about love than about how to write poetry.— Discuss.
 - (b) Consider Lady Mary Wroth's "Pity my Loving, nay of Conscience Give" as a conventional Elizabethan sonnet.
 - (c) Consider "The Pulley" as a metaphysical poem.
- 6. Answer the following questions: 10×1
 - (a) What are, in Bacon's view, the 'fruits of friendship'? Discuss with reference to Bacon's Of Friendship.
 - (b) Bacon's essays are 'impersonal, objective and orderly in thought'. Discuss with special reference to his essays you have read.

7. Answer the following questions:

(a) How does Shakespeare mark a departure from the conventional sonneteers in the depiction of his mistress in Sonnet No.130?

In which context are Seneca and Plato referred to in "Renouncing of Love"?

Why does Bacon refer to the enigma of Heraclitus: Dry light is ever the best, in "Of Friendship"?
