 - (d) Discuss the view that the theme of All for Love is the conflict of reason and honour with passion in the form of illicit love.

 - (a) How does Addison portray the picture of Sir Roger de Coverley in his essay, Sir Roger at Home?

- (b) Comment on The Style of Steele's prose with reference to 'The Spectator Club'.

 - (a) Consider Gulliver's Travels as a story of fantasy and adventure.
 - (b) Discuss Gulliver's role as a mask of Swift.
 - (c) Attempt an essay on Behn's approach to the issue of Slavery.
 - (d) Would you Consider Oroonoko as a tragic hero? Give reasons for your answer.

 - (a) How does Swift Satirise the English people by depicting the Lilliputians in Gulliver's Travels, BK-I?
 - (b) Attempt a study of the widow figure in Oroonoko.
