  - (d) Critically comment on Coleridge as a critic of Shakespeare's plays, with special reference to

any one of Shakespeare's plays that has been analysed by Coleridge.

- 2. Answer any four of the following: 4×4
  - (a) Comment on Shakespeare's use of 'disguise' (with reference to Twelfth Night).
  - (b) How has the Porter been presented in any one Bangla adaptation of *Macbeth*.
  - (c) Briefly comment on the role of the Gravediggers in Hamlet.
  - (d) How was Polonius killed?
  - (e) Explain:

"Now, good my lord,

Let there be some more test made of my metal,

Before so noble and so great a figure

Be stamp'd upon it."

- "Well, heaven forgive him; and forgive us all: Some rise by sin and some by virtue fall"

    - Who is the Speaker? Explain the phrase "the demigod authority".
  - (f) "We must not make a scarecrow of the law."

    Who is the speaker? What does the speaker mean by this statement?

- (h) Which one is considered by Coleridge as the most painful work of Shakespeare? Give one reason for his choice.
