  - (a) What does J. L. Austin mean by 'Constatives' and 'Performatives'?
  - (b) What is the perlocutionary force of an utterance? Answer after J. L. Austin.

- (c) What is propositional attitude?
- (d) How does Frege make the distinction between 'sense' and 'reference' of a proper name?
- (e) What is the structure of a picture? Answer following Wittgenstein's Tractatus Logico-Philosophicus.
- (f) How is the world divided into facts?
- (g) Why does Wittgenstein hold (in *Philosophical Investigations*) that it seems to him that Augustine does not speak of there being any difference between kinds of words?
- (h) How can a script be considered as a language? Answer following Wittgenstein.
- 2. Answer any four questions of the following:  $4 \times 4$ 
  - (a) According to J. L. Austin, when one says "I promise", one is not ostensibly describing anything or stating a fact, but performing a social act. Elucidate the view.

- (b) Explain the main tenets of the referential theory of meaning.
- (c) What is Frege's puzzle concerning identity statements.
- (d) What are the illocutionary, and locutionary features of an utterance? Explain.
- (e) How can the objects contain the possibility of all situations? Answer after Wittgenstein.
- (f) What does Wittgenstein mean by "ostensive teaching of words" in *Philosophical Investigations*?
- (g) What is a "logical picture" according to *Tractatus*?
- (h) Give an example to show how a kind of language is meant to serve for communication between a builder A and an assistant B according to Philosophical Investigations.
- 3. Answer any two questions of the following:  $8 \times 2$ 
  - (a) According to Bertrand Russell, what are the philosophical puzzles associated with the

sentence "the present king of France is bald"? How does Russell respond to these puzzles such sentences generate?

- (b) How does Frege respond to the philosophical puzzle concerning identity statements? Discuss.
- (c) Why does Wittgenstein claim in his *Tractatus* that there are no pictures that are truly apriori?
- (d) Write an essay on Wittgenstein's conception of "language game" in his *Philosophical Investigations*.
