## GLOSSARY

1. Amlah: Subordinate native officers.

2. *Aurang* : A place where export goods are manufactured or collected for wholesale disposal. A group of villages or small towns in the country constituted one aurang.

- 3. *Bund* : The local name of the silk harvest.
- 4. Banyan : Native business partner of a European merchant.
- 5. *Cattanee* : Female spinner or simply reeler.
- 6. *Chandraki* : Spinning screen or tray, made of bamboo. Also known as talias chanches or fingas.
- 7. Dalal : Broker.
- 8. Dalas : Made of bamboo and used for silk-worm rearing.
- 9. Filature wound silk : Silk produced in European filature was known as filature reeled silk.
- 10. *Ghai* : Country machine by which khamru or khangru silk is produced.
- 11. Gomasta : An agent employed by merchants and Company for their trade.
- 12. Investment : Company's purchases in India were known as 'Investment'.
- 13. *Maund* : 40 seers.
- 14. *Palu* : Silk worm.

15. *Patta* : Short-skein, the first two sorts of Bengal raw silk head and belly, i.e., 'Cabessa' and 'bariga'.

16. *Pykar* : An underbroker, mainy employed in the raw silk trade of Bengal i.e., silk dealer, middle men or a village broker who dealt with the weaver on a commission basis.

17. *Ryot* : Peasant, Cultivator.

18. *Raw Silk* : Raw Silk is not purely raw. It is in between purely raw and finished product. It is semi manufactured stuff.

19. Yarn : Thread i.e., twisted silk fibres used in weaving and knitting.

20. Zamindar : Landlord.
