- 7. Do you think that the theory of 'economic growth' explains the nature of the Industrial Revolution in England?
- 8. Is the theory of 'substitution process an adequate explanation of the nature of the Industrial Revolution in continental Europe?
- 9. How did the Zollvorin and the railways prepare the ground for the rapid industrialisation in the German states in the 1850s and 1860s?
